Each team enjoyed large leads at times during the races, but then unpredictable things would happen. The starting line proved to be a great equalizer as each boat began its start on a second, third or final lap of a race. Time and again a team member meant to start the next lap almost simultaneously as another team member finished, failed to be on the starting line and gave away the lead they were handed. This of course drove the team mates at the dock crazy as they urged their guy to get to the start line early.



All the boats were in sight of the race committee and the team members at all times, and interest in the racing on the course never flagged. In one instance the race committee got so absorbed in the tight finish of a lap they completely ignored the starting line on the opposite side of the RC boat and missed a starter who may have been over early.

Blue, Red and Gold Continued...

Ted Ishikawa got so caught up watching his team mates compete on the course that he drifted into the East Beach swim area and got his Sabot rudder tangled in the buoy line ... and he was the next start. Ted had a very hard time extracting himself while his team at first just watched and then started shouting advice from the dock. Almost instantly, in a show of competitive spirit or poor sportsmanship depending on which team you were on, the Red and Gold teams starting raising a din to drown out those giving Ted advice. Ted finally managed to extract himself and got to the starting line on time. That was bad news for the other two teams as Ted always managed to win his lap, even when he was handed a large distance to make up.

Hot competition continued all day, with frequent lead changes during the racing. If one team started to build a lead the wind gods intervened and either took the wind away from the lead boat or threw in a wind shift until the other teams caught up. The pole with a flag marking one end of the start line also served as the leeward mark. There was plenty of action there as the boats in tight quarters tried to maneuver for advantage as they jibed for the upwind leg. This was a great show for the teammates on the East Beach dock as well as the race committee. More boats did penalty turns, including this writer, than ever seen at any previous regatta. Shawn McGraw was seen doing three penalty turns in a single race.

After two races Blue and Red were all tied up, each with a first and a second place. Blue went on to win thanks to fast sailing by all their team, but especially Shawn McGraw who had his Balboa 13 moving exceptionally well in the better winds of the day and to Allyn Edwards and Frank Roberts who kept their foot on the gas as they pulled away in their Capri 14.2 to clinch the win for Blue... by one point! Congratulations to the Blue Team for their re-peat.

Please keep in mind, a yacht club is no different from a person's home with respect to guests. A club is owned and financed by its members primarily for their own use. There is nothing automatic about reciprocal privileges. These reciprocal privileges are not intended to entitle guests "wholesale" use of the other's facility.

Under no circumstances should a yachtsman assume that all yacht clubs are reciprocal and before requesting entrance to another club should check with his club to insure a reciprocal agreement exists. A prudent yachtsperson will make his/her visit to another club more enjoyable if he/she follows these simple rules of courtesy as follows:

- Verify you have reciprocal privilege.
- Call ahead for permission to visit so your visit will not conflict with other club functions.
- Always show your LMVYC membership card & sign the guest register. Be prepared to show it courteously to staff and members of the club upon request.
- Always be courteous with club employees.
- When planning a visit with your own boat make arrangements as far in advance as possible.
- Write a thank you note and mention any members or employees who were particularly helpful.
- If you have been invited to participate in a regatta or race conduct yourself as a guest

Club Top Skipper for 2010!

Ten of southern California's finest dinghy sailors competed for LMVYC's annual Top Skipper Regatta, Sunday October 24th. Competitors were hand-picked from LMVYC's A, B & C Fleets based upon their 2010 performance & race attendance as well as past performance. This year's racers included Measurer Horst Weiler, Treasurer Willi Hugelshofer, S/C Arnold Christensen, S/C Frank Fournier, V/C Peter Tietz, C14.2K Fleet Captain Bill Yount, Port Captain Frank Roberts, Balboa Fleet Captain Sean McGraw, S/C Tony Musolino & Commodore Randy Tiffany.

Competitors selected their first C14.2K by a blind draw at the Club House and exchanged boats at the East Beach Dock after every race.

Five races were sailed under the watchful eyes of R/C Michelle Assay, Allyn & Sue Edwards. Jr. S/C Morrie Willkie & Cathie Willkie were busy setting & resetting the windward mark as the wind direction shifted left to right and back again.

With no "throw outs" allowed every race counted! Winds were strong enough to allow for some of the longest windward marks we've raced all season as in past 3 and down to 2! Tacking duels ensued as sailors searched for that perfect lift on notoriously shifty breezes. Racing was tight as were the scores after three races; first through fourth places were separated by only 3 points!

At the end of five evenly contested races first, second and third places were separated by only two points! Commodore Randy Tiffany captured the Club Champion Title by finishing the regatta with his second first place finish in the fourth race & a 3rd place finish in the last to overcome a two point deficit at the break.

Racers & Race Committee were treated to homemade deli sandwiches courtesy of our own Quarter Master Frank Roberts.



Randy Tiffany commented after the race, "Winning the LMVYC Club Champion title for 2010 is especially rewarding as my name will be found along side of some of the best sailors to have sailed in southern California. 
